HEMINGFORD FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP FUND
GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Only graduates of Hemingford High School are eligible for scholarships. The Hemingford High School Scholarship is available each year to Hemingford graduates who successfully continue to pursue a post high school degree. The application requests that the student list any awards or activities. This applies to the student's achievements since high school. You do not need to list Hemingford High School Achievements, as these are already documented.

The application should be submitted on 8 1/2 x 11 paper, bound neatly at the left side in a standard binder or cover. Remove all letters from envelopes and bind the letters flat. Exhibits evidencing notable achievements in scholarship, leadership, athletics, dramatics, community service, or other activities may be attached. Elaborate presentation is unnecessary, but the scholarship committee will give preference to applications submitted with such exhibits. **CARELESS PRESENTATION DEFINITELY HANDICAPS THE APPLICANT.** Applicants should include the following:

1. A statement outlining your objectives for further education and any information you wish the scholarship committee to consider in evaluating your request for assistance. The statement should be 250 words or less.
2. A letter of not more than 200 words from a parent or guardian presenting a true picture of the family situation and showing applicant's need for financial assistance.
3. In order to determine financial need the scholarship committed requires
 - a) A copy of your SAR (student aid report)
 - b) A copy of your institutional financial aid offer
 - c) A statement of your current student debt
 - d) A copy of your transcripts of college credits with either current semesters grades included or a statement of classes with grades.

Typewritten statements are preferred over handwritten submissions. Statements must be signed in all instances. Return all bound applications to the high school guidance office, or email the completed application to dpinnt@gubn.org. The deadline for students in their first year of college who are applying for spring semester funds is **January 2**. The deadline for college students applying for scholarship funds for the following year is **July 1**.
