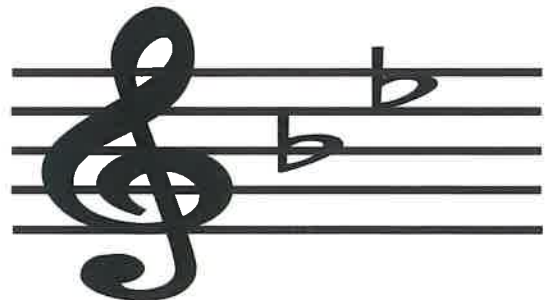
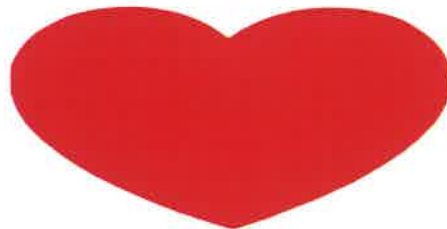

JH QUIZBOWL YEAR IN REVIEW



THE JH QUIZ BOWL TEAM STARTED THE SEASON ON DECEMBER 1ST THIS YEAR. COMPETING IN SIDNEY WAS A CHALLENGE AS THE PROCESS WAS NEW TO HALF THE TEAM AND GETTING A STRATEGY FOR THE GROUP WAS VERY DIFFICULT. AFTER THE FIRST ROUND WE WERE SITTING IN LAST PLACE. AS THE MEET WENT ON, OUR ATHLETES ENDED UP FINDING THEIR GROOVE AND FINISHING IN 6TH PLACE WITH 195 POINTS.

After a lot of practice and questions, the team went on and competed at Sioux County for the PAC Meet on March 18th. Our athletes took the first round competing against Sioux County 75-0. They went on to the second round against Edgemont and swept that round 65-25. Round 3 started off a little slow but we pulled it off with a 40-10 lead. The fourth round was very tight up until the last question. The athletes lost this round 65-70. A huge comeback in the 5th and 6th round against Crawford (75-10) and Hyannis (60-45) wins. After 6 rounds, the athletes took home first place. Way to go!



Again on March 22, Chadron held their annual meet. We took 2 teams to this meet. Both teams did very well. Team #2 did very well against Gering, taking that round with a 50-35 lead. In their second round, against Sidney, they came up a little bit short in points with a loss of 95-55. Strategies in the third round were not working against Gordon/Rushville and ended up losing to them 20-55. This team being new and never competing alone did an excellent job in looking for strategies to get them points. Team #1 had a rough start for rounds 1 and 3. Strategies that worked in the past were not working today. Alliance took round 1 (65-45). Round two, we dominated with a 105-75 lead over Gordon/Rushville. Then as luck had it in round 3, Sidney took over 80-50. The team ended up in 4th place.



This next month, the JH Quiz Bowl will be traveling to Gering for the final meet on April 19. We wish them all the best of luck in their final competition and for a great season.

Provide Choices for your child's clothing each morning.

Language at Home

Providing Choices for children encourages communication and language development. By providing more than one choice, children have more opportunities to practice communication by talking about things in their environment. Sometimes it is helpful for young children to have a visual picture or object representation of their choices.

Examples of Providing Choices:

- During play ask your child, 'Do you want a doll or car?'
- When getting dressed ask, 'Do you like the red shirt or blue shirt?'
- Hold up two books and ask, 'Do you want the dinosaur book or the train book?'
- During snack ask your child, 'Would you like crackers or carrots?'
- When sitting down ask, 'Would you like to sit on the floor or in a chair?'
- After finishing a game ask, 'Would you like to play again or choose another activity?'

Activities

• Talk about the weather with your child each morning. Describe what you see, hear, and feel outside. Discuss what clothing you wear on a sunny day versus a stormy day.

- Sing songs about the weather such as 'Mr. Sun:'
Oh Mr. Sun, Sun, Mr. Golden Sun,
Please shine down on me.
Oh Mr. Sun, Sun, Mr. Golden Sun,
Hiding behind a tree.
These little children are asking you
To please come out so
We can play with you.
Oh Mr. Sun, Sun, Mr. Golden Sun,
Please shine down on me!
- Practice Providing Choices when your child is not excited about an activity in order to give them some control over the situation. For instance, if your child does not like vegetables give them a choice of two different vegetables during dinner.

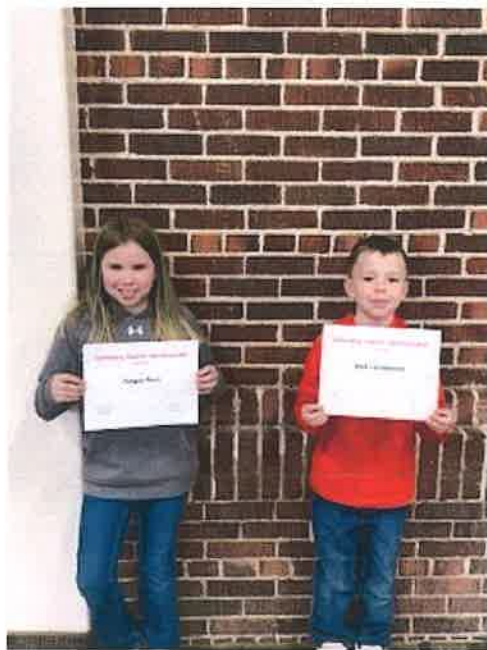


Elementary PE News
