From the Superintendent's Standpoint March 2025

As a school district, we value communication and work hard to provide our students, staff, and community with ample information about our school district and the opportunities available here. This month, I would like to highlight some sources of general information about our school district.

Each year, our district issues an "Annual Report to Patrons" that includes a variety of information about our school district, including enrollment and assessment information and a high-level overview of our Strategic Plan. These reports are available on our school website. If you haven't had the opportunity to read our most recent report, I would encourage you to click here: Hemingford Public Schools Annual Report

If you are interested in more detailed information about our strategic plan and the progress we are making, you can view the Hemingford Public Schools Strategic Plan Dashboard. This dashboard has two main pages. The first, the "indicators" page, includes various metrics about our school's performance, finances, and student participation in the various opportunities we provide to our students. The second, the "strategy" page, includes information about our most recent assessment of our progress on the guiding principles, strategies, and indicators that make up our strategic plan. Our strategic plan lays out a vision of what we want to have accomplished by the end of 2027. We have seen significant progress and continue to focus on bringing the aspirations of the strategic plan to fruition.

Over the next few months we will be having several conversations as a community about our school facilities. As you likely know, our district recently completed the process of conducting a facilities assessment. I would encourage all of our patrons to read both the Hemingford Public Schools Facilities Assessment and the accompanying Assessment and Energy Audit, which includes information about the state of the mechanical, electrical, plumbing, fire protection, and technology systems.

Patrons are encouraged to follow the work of the Board of Education. On this site patrons can view the agenda for board meetings (typically posted the Friday before Monday board meetings) and can review the minutes of the Board Meetings. This information is regularly kept up to date on the board's Meetings Page.

Finally, I encourage every patron of the school district to download and use our <u>Mobile App</u>. It is the easiest and best way to stay updated on everything from our strategic plan dashboard to the lunch menu.

As always, I welcome your feedback and ideas on how we can continue to make this school year exceptional. Please don't hesitate to reach out—whether by phone, email, or stopping by the office. Your input is invaluable as we work together to create the best possible learning environment for our students.

NEBRASKA SMART IS A FREE VIRTUAL TUTORING PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS IN GRADES K-12.

HOW IT WORKS

Nebraska students in grades K-12 have free access to online tutoring with a qualified Tutor in English, math, science, and social studies. Parents must first register their child. Once registered, students can request pre-scheduled appointments with a Tutor or log in and request on-demand tutoring to be connected with the next Tutor available in the queue. Students should provide homework for which they wish to receive help or topics that they would like to cover.






OUR PARTNERS
