FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S STANDPOINT APRIL 2025

As a school community, we have an important upcoming opportunity to engage in one of our most important responsibilities as citizens: exercising our right and responsibility to vote.

At the March meeting, our Board of Education approved a resolution to call for an election by the residents of our school district on whether to issue bonds to pay for school facility improvements. (The full ballot question is located at the end of this article).

To ensure an informed electorate, the school district will be providing several opportunities for patrons to learn about the proposed facilities concepts and the financing of the project over the next several weeks.

Two important opportunities will be available to our community on April 7th and April 23rd. On both of these days, patrons are invited to come to the school for tours between Noon and 7:00 PM. At 7:00 PM we will host community presentations in the gym, which will include a brief overview of the project, answers to frequently asked questions, and opportunities for conversations with members of the Board of Education and the professionals who have helped develop the proposed facilities concepts, planning for construction, and financing of the proposed improvements.

I encourage every voter in the district to come, learn about the project, interact with fellow community members, and be prepared to make an informed decision when voting.

As always, I welcome your feedback and ideas on how we can continue to make this school year exceptional. Please don't hesitate to reach out—whether by phone, email, or stopping by the office. Your input is invaluable as we work together to create the best possible learning environment for our students.

Keep up the outstanding work, Bobcat Nation! Here is the question that will be on the ballot:

“Shall Box Butte County School District 0010 (Hemingford Public Schools) in the State of Nebraska issue its bonds in a total principal amount not to exceed \$17,975,000 for the purposes of financing the costs of (a) constructing one or more additions to the District’s existing facilities, including (i) an addition to its existing elementary school building, including a library, a kitchen, a cafeteria/multipurpose room and other support spaces, (ii) an addition to its existing gymnasium, including a new weight room, a new entrance and a connector to the existing elementary school building, and (iii) an addition to its career and technical education classroom building, (b) purchasing equipment, furniture and apparatus for such additions, and (c) certain site improvements and the demolition of the central administration building to make room for such additions; said bonds to be issued from time to time, to be sold at such prices, to bear interest at such rates, to become due at such times, and to have such other terms and provisions, all as may be fixed and determined by the Board of Education of the District; and

“Shall the District cause to be levied and collected annually a special levy of taxes against all the taxable property in the District sufficient in rate and amount to pay the principal of, the premium, if any, and the interest on said bonds as the same become due?”

The Superintendent of schools is authorized by the Board of Education to close public schools in case of severe weather. The Superintendent will notify local news media when inclement weather warrants such action. The information will be transmitted by the Remind App, the School's Facebook page, X, and the Hemingford Public Schools App.

School notifications will also be posted through Remind, Facebook, and X.

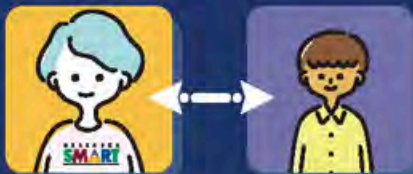

The Nebraska Department of Education has awarded a grant to the Nebraska State Colleges to develop a program that provides free online tutoring to K-12 students in rural Nebraska.



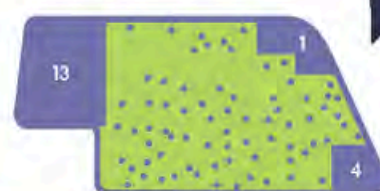
